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Program Information

A country's literary tradition can be better evaluated when compared with other literary traditions and by its relationship with other forms of art. The major goal of the Master's Program *Comparative Literature* offered by the Department of Turkish Language and Literature is to provide students a better understanding of Turkish literature through a comparison of Turkish literary tradition with other literary traditions and cultures of the world. Educating students to become international researchers with a broad perspective, and educating teachers and teacher candidates to have a contemporary view of the field of literature are among the other goals of the program. The interaction of literature with mythology, cinema, music, fine arts, among others, is featured in this Master's program along with a special focus on the comparison of Turkish literatures.

The Master's Program *Comparative Literature* admits students who have a BA degree in Turkish language and literature as well as students who hold a degree from another field. Those students who have a background in a field other than Turkish language and literature are expected to attend a preparation program, whose content is designed on the basis of each student's needs.

Goals	Turkish Literature meets Western Literature after the declaration of Tanzimat; and certain works were translated in Turkish. The western style of short stories, novels and poetry get written down. Literary movements emerged in the West were started to be followed. The main aim was to write such works corresponded to the Western literature. In this course, the relationship between Post-Tanzimat Turkish Literature and Western Literature has been examined in detail.
Content	Tanzimat has been extremely important for Turkish society in every aspect. In the period of Tanzimat, Western literature has become an explanatory model for Turkish writers. Level of Qualification

Upon the completion of the program, program qualifications, necessary courses (60 ECTS) and the MA Thesis, which is a partial requirement for the MA degree, students become eligible to obtain an MA degree.

Admission Requirements

The MA Program *Comparative Literature* is open to all students who have a BA degree either in Turkish Language and Literature or in another discipline, and who qualify in the written and oral examinations administered by the Department of Turkish Language and Literature. Students who are unable to get a minimum score in one of the national and/or international English language examinations such as ÜDS (organised by ÖSYM, Turkey), TOEFL, or IELTS, or who fail in the examination administered by the Preparation School of Yeditepe University must attend the Preparatory School at Yeditepe University for up to four semesters depending on their levelof proficiency in the English language. The Remedial Program, which is for a year, and which is not included in the official deadline for completing the MA Program, is compulsory for all students who have a BA degree in adiscipline other than Turkish Language and Literature.

Occupational Profiles

The students completing the MA Program in Comparative Literature successfully can have jobs in higher education as academics, in secondary education as teachers, in the media as journalists and/or editors, in the field of public relations and communication, and in the related private sector and state offices.

Graduation Requirements

To be able to get an M.A. degree in Comparative Literature, students must take courses whose ECTS add up at least to 60 (the courses taken in the Remedial year are not included), and must write a thesis dissertation that satisfies the requirements indicated in the regulations of Yeditepe University; and finally, must be successful in defending their dissertations.
