1. Program Information

Students must have a Master's Degree in the field of history if they complete the research and dissertation process which consists of writing and defense of thesis after the course load.

4. Condition Conditions:

The student who wants to enroll in the master's program has to complete the examinations and / or have completed the courses determined by the university within the academic and legal regulations and determined by YÖK. Programa acceptance and application conditions are published on the website of the Institute of Social Sciences (www.sbe.yeditepe.edu.tr) before the start of the academic semester.

5. Employment Opportunities and Transition to Upper Level

Students who graduate from this department can continue their academic life as research assistants or lecturers at universities, as well as find jobs in other public and private sectors that research and study historical issues.

Students who have successfully completed the program can apply for a doctorate degree in the field of history or other branches of science accepting students from this area

6. Graduation Requirements:

Students have to reach 120 ECTS in total thesis program and 90 ECTS in non-thesis program in order to complete the program.

Following the completion of the course, a thesis study (60 ECTS) must be made in a subject that will be determined under the supervision of the instructor. In addition, the student who is accepted as a thesis is required to successfully present his work in front of the jury to be orally appointed.
