

Information of Local Governments and Governance Graduate Program

1. Program Description

Foundation: Graduate program of Local Governments and Governance (thesis/non-thesis) which established under the department of Public Administration within the Institute of Social Sciences will begin accepting students in the academic year 2014-2015.

Purpose: Ensure to improving and deepening information level of expertise about the Local Governments and Governance area. Also, trainings and executed program allows to understand interdisciplinary interaction. Discuss, present, and express himself as a professional and academic in a study requiring expertise on Local Government and Governance in an intellectual framework is another important dimension of the program.

Target: Interdisciplinary work with the intellectual framework should take place to train experts in the academic field as well as in public institutions in the field of Local Governments and Governance.

Qualification: Students will have a Master's degree in Local Government and Governance area when the program is successfully completed and requirements are met.

Level of Qualification: Graduate

Registration and Admission: Candidates graduated from Public Administration, Political Science and Public Administration, Political Science, International Relations, Political Science and International Relations and the Law department can directly start the program in dormitory higher education institutions with 4-year bachelor's degree, however there is preparatory program for students who have graduated from other departments.

- Candidates who graduated from YÖK equivalent and relevant international institutions of higher education may apply to the Local Government and Governance Graduate Program.
- ALES score of candidates for the Master's program must be a minimum 55 points that Yeditepe University Institute of Social Sciences accept any type of score.
- In the non-thesis program, ALES is not required by the decision of the Council of Higher Education.

- The program language is English. A necessity to succeed in the English Proficiency Examination held by the Yeditepe University. Or ÜDS, KPDS or YDS is 66, TOEFL is 79, IELTS is 5.5 points necessary to have, entered in the last two years.
- English language proficiency exam, includes Beginner, Intermediate and Advanced English programs. Successful candidates at the placement test are exempted from the English Preparatory Program and begin to direct the course. Candidates who are not successful, they complete the degree program by attending one of these three stages.

Qualification Requirements and Regulation

In the Local Government and Governance Master Program, course requirements must be completed, 60 ECTS for thesis and 72 ECTS for non-thesis program. The student must have an average weight of at least 2.00 out of 4.00 is required qualification for graduation.

Thesis and non-thesis program conditions are as follows:

Thesis: Master's Degree program with thesis; totally consist 4 semesters including 2 semesters continued lessons and 2 semesters thesis lesson. Local Government and Governance Master's program (with thesis) consist of not less than 24 credits at least eight (8) courses, seminars and two periods thesis course. Non-credit seminar course, is considered successful or unsuccessful. Students in the semester of the seminar was taken to register for this course and at the end of the semester must submit a final project report. Students in *Political Science and International Relations Master of Science and Public Administration Degree Program* taking maximum 2 lessons from 3 credits which head of the department find appropriate can replace Local Government and Governance Master of Science (Thesis) electives in their program.

Non-thesis: Master Degree program with non-thesis; totally consist 3 semesters including 2 semesters continued lessons and 1 semester graduation project. Local Government and Governance Master of Science (non-thesis) program consist of 10 lessons required not less than 30 credits and graduation project (1) lesson. Master Graduation Project is a non-credit course, is considered successful or unsuccessful. Students in the semester in which the course is taken of the Graduation Project to register for this course and at the end of the semester must submit a final project report. Students of *Political Science and International Relations Master of Science and Public Administration Degree Program* taking maximum 2 lessons from 3 credits which head of the department find appropriate can replace Local Government and Governance Master of Science (non-thesis) electives in their program.

Program Profile

Local Government and Governance Master program is opened for the first time at our university within the framework of the evolving needs of our country. This program examines the local authorities due to the content. Local development policies, urban sociology, quickly spread transparency in the world with urban policy and environmental policy, based on accountability and participation principles envisages a more dynamic public structure governance concepts will be discussed in detail unlike the other master programs. Local Government and Governance Graduate Program is collaborating with especially Law, Political Science and International Relations, Economics, and so on.

The program is newly opened, did not graduate.

Passing to Top Degree Programs

Local Administration and Governance Master Program currently have not top degree programs.

Exams, Assesment and Evaluation

There are final exams immediately following the end of each semester, usually within two weeks after end of the semester. Besides a mid-term or project work can be done.
